## **DEAN CARPENTER AWARD**

Dean Carpenter was a nurse practitioner at the Neighborhood Service Organization's Tumani Center in Detroit and the University of Michigan Medical Center in Ann Arbor. He had an incredible passion both for teaching, spending many years as a clinical preceptor, and for providing care to those who needed it. He became a trusted figure in the world of street medicine to his patients, and provided not only medical care and support, but also a listening ear. In his memory, we highlight the actions of other amazing and dedicated individuals that are changing the world of street medicine.

This year's Dean Carpenter Award winner is **Dr. Bryan Felice, MD**. Dr. Felice is an emergency medicine physician at Corewell Health, and was the lead physician helping students at Oakland University William Beaumont University School of Medicine start their street medicine program in 2019. When the COVID19 pandemic began shortly after, he persisted in seeing street medicine patients so that they would not slip though the cracks. Now, five years later, Dr. Felice continues to dedicate countless hours volunteering with Street Medicine Oakland. Not only does he care for patients and teach residents and students, but as medical director of the program, he also coordinates volunteers, manages finances, and secures funding via grants and awards. Recently, SMO received an award through the Michigan Hospital Association for their work, and this award was championed by Dr. Felice. His colleagues describe Dr. Felice as a dedicated and fantastic physician, and laud his leadership and his passion for caring for the underserved.

## FEATURED SPEAKERS

**Dr. Samuel Jackson** is a native Michigander, grew up in Northern Michigan went to medical school at Central Michigan University where he started CMU Street Medicine as a 4th year medical student in 2018. He completed his adult psychiatry residency at SUNY Downstate in Brooklyn NY, Public Psychiatry Fellowship at Columbia University and worked as a Street Psychiatrist at Janian, the U.S.'s largest group of psychiatric providers serving people experiencing homelessness in NYC. He recently moved to Chicago where he's the Clinical Director of Psychiatry at Erie Family Health and will be working at Rush's The Center to Transform Health and Housing, continuing his Street Psychiatry work.

**Veronika Scott** is the founder and CEO of the Empowerment Plan, a Detroit-based workforce development organization. She is dedicated to employing and empowering unhoused individuals to break the generational cycle of homelessness. Born to parents who struggled with mental health, addiction, unemployment, and poverty, Veronika now serves as a leading global voice advocating for reform and raising awareness about the systemic issues that shaped her life and affect millions of humans daily. Under Veronika's visionary leadership, the Empowerment Plan has impacted over 85,000 lives around the globe through the innovatve sleeping bag coats it manufactures and the sustainable jobs it provides. Veronika has received numerous accolades, including the IDEA Gold Award, the People's Voice Award, Forbes 3 under 30, CNN's 10 Visionary Women, and the John F Kennedy New Frontier Award.

**Dr. Jim Withers** is a physician trained in Internal Medicine and part of the teaching faculty of the University of Pittsburgh since his residency in 1988. Special areas of interest have been international medicine, wilderness medicine, domestic violence and homeless healthcare. In 1992 he created Operation Safety Net as part of the Pittsburgh Mercy health system to provide healthcare to the unsheltered homeless. In 2005 he initiated the annual International Street Medicine Symposium and in 2009 he and others created the Street Medicine Institute. Through extensive travel, speaking and consultations he has spearheaded the spread of the global street medicine movement.
